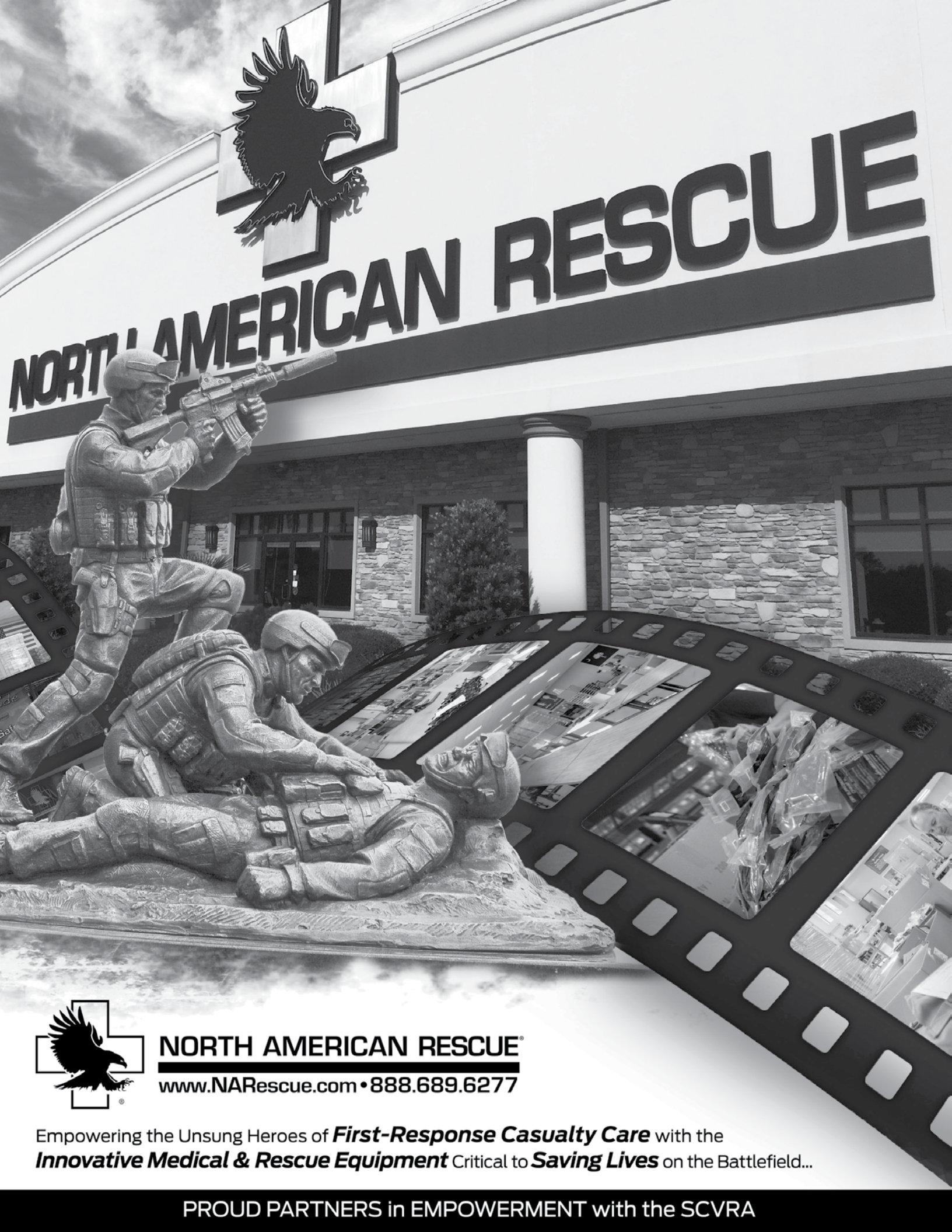

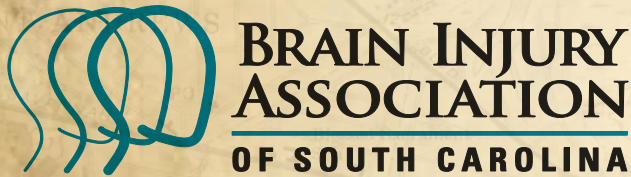

Boice completed his Masters of Social Work at the University of South Carolina, and is a Certified Addictions Counselor with the State of South Carolina. He is a 21-year United States Air Force Veteran, working 16 of those years in addiction and mental health care for active duty service members. Boice is a certified trainer of Motivational Interviewing, and was highly involved with the initial introduction of Motivational Interviewing into the Air Force's Substance Abuse program while stationed at Kirtland AFB in Albuquerque, NM, working side by side with the University of New Mexico with the authors of *Motivational Interviewing*.

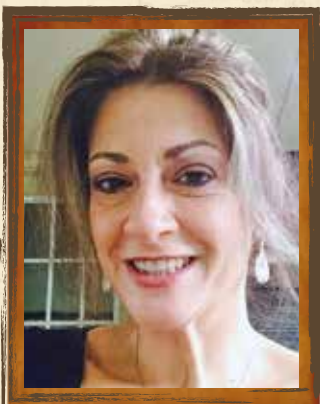

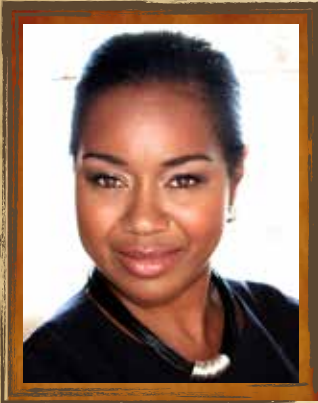

She provides services at the Charleston facility as well as to its six community-based outpatient clinics in South Carolina and Georgia. Dr. Denier also serves as the Charleston VAMC's Military Sexual Trauma (MST) Coordinator, conducting outreach and staff training and providing clinical care.



**Valeska Gioia, Ed.S., ATP:** Valeska Gioia is an Educational/Assistive Technology Specialist and Autism Consultant for VR's Rehabilitation Technology unit. Valeska has previously worked as an Assistive Technology Specialist for the SC Department of Education and was Vice President of Educational Services at the SC Autism Society.
